



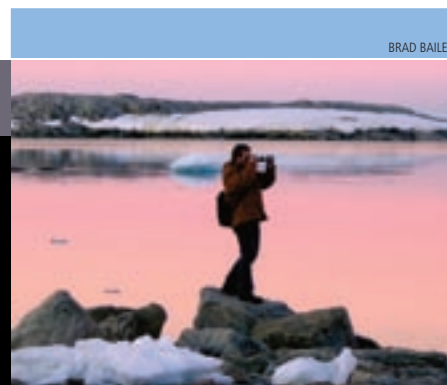
*The more I stay here the more I love Antarctica.*
