The specimens have been subject to the mandatory treatment with ultralow freezing at -70°C for seven consecutive days. Samples were subject to this treatment offshore, within Casey station laboratory facilities (Antarctica), from 7–15 January, 2019.

Specimens were inspected prior to packaging and were found to be free from excess soil and are not knowingly infected with potentially viable pathogenic micro-organisms.
